## Winners of the 2020 ETSI Science Writing Competition

On 5 August 2020, the Emory-Tibet Science Initiative (ETSI) announced a science writing competition for monastics engaged in ETSI's science education programs to celebrate His Holiness the Dalai Lama's immense contributions to the monastic science education and to encourage the monastic students to think, reflect, and write—in their own language—on scientific concepts and thus add to the growing scientific literature in Tibetan.

Three categories were proposed: 1) A comparative study of an interesting and relevant topic from Buddhism and science, 2) A detailed study on a specific scientific topic, and 3) Translation of an important scientific article, paper or a book chapter.

We received sixty proposals, out of which thirty one were selected to be developed into full essays. The twenty three entries that met the requirements were carefully read and graded by a panel of three judges. We are happy to announce that twelve entries—eleven in the comparative category and one in the translation category—are selected as winners. See the table below for the winners' list.

Ranking 1 to 7 will be awarded \$1500.00 each; 8-11 will be awarded \$1000.00 each; and the Translation Entry will be awarded \$500.00.
